- AAA Northern New England Automotive Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship is offered to students enrolled in the Automotive Technology program at the following colleges – White Mountains Community College, Lakes Region Community College, Manchester Community College or Nashua Community College. Priority will be given to freshman students & Previous AAA Scholarship recipients.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be a NH resident.
- Applicant must be in the Automotive Technology Program.
- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.
- Applicant may be enrolled in any of the four Community Colleges that offer Automotive Technology.

- CCSNH Anne R. O'Keefe Scholarship Fund

Overview

The purpose of this Scholarship fund is to support annual scholarships to a deserving honor graduate or graduates of Littleton High School who excel in mathematics and plan to pursue a career in a field of mathematics, and to an honor graduate or graduates who show outstanding determination and leadership in either mechanical or business oriented programs.

Qualifications

- Applicant must have graduated from Littleton High School.
- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.
- Applicant must have at least a 2.5 Cumulative GPA.

- CCSNH BJ Eckardt Scholarship

Overview

The BJ Eckardt Scholarship Fund was established to benefit Belmont, NH students. Applicants should be entering their second year of college in the fall of 2019. Applicants may be attending any of the seven Community Colleges in the System. Students may be enrolled either part-time or full-time and must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. Applicants should have financial need, which will be determined in consultation with the Financial Aid Office; therefore applicants should have completed a FAFSA. Applicants who participated in volunteer community service will be given preference. Students may write and submit a cover letter with their application (strongly recommended) stating why the student believes they deserve the award.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be a 2nd year student.

- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.
- Applicant may be attending any of the seven CCSNH colleges.
- Applicant must be a resident of Belmont, NH.
- Applicant may be a full-time or part-time student.
- Applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

• CCSNH New Hampshire Scholars Award

Overview

The NH Scholars award is a \$500 tuition waiver for students who have graduated from a participating NH Scholar High School and who have completed the NH Scholars Core Course of Study. Each Community College may grant up to twelve (12) \$500 NH Scholar awards. See www.nhscholars.org for a list of participating high schools. **While priority will be given to high schools within their regions, Presidents, at their discretion, may offer scholarships to students outside their respective regions. Scholarships are not transferrable to other CCSNH colleges. ** The award is valid for one year following the student's high school graduation date.

Qualifications

- Applicant may be attending any of the NH Community Colleges.
- Applicant must have completed the NH Scholars Core Course of Study.
- Applicant must be enrolled at least half-time (6 credits) for the upcoming semester.

• CCSNH New Hampshire Valedictorian Scholarship

Overview

Effective August 2011, a one year tuition only scholarship up to a maximum of 32 credits will be awarded to designated New Hampshire high school valedictorians, based on a cumulative grade point average, from a New Hampshire NEASC accredited institution. The one year will be defined as the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters, with a start date of any of the three and applied only within the one year from the time of first semester of matriculation. The recipient must enroll as a matriculated student at any of the NH Community Colleges within 15 months from the time of high school graduation. The scholarship may be applied to tuition costs only.

Qualifications

- Applicant may be attending any of the NH Community Colleges.
- Applicant must have been the valedictorian of their high school class.

• GBCC Access Scholarship for New Students

Overview

This scholarship money is intended to **cover the gap between free money** (federal, state, or other grants/scholarships that do not require repayment) **and the cost of attending Great Bay** (tuition, fees, books, and supplies). Individual awards will likely range from \$250 to \$1,000.

To be eligible, students must be enrolled at least half time (6 or more credits) in a degree or certificate program for the fall and must have completed a FAFSA. Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received, and scholarships will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Qualifications

- Student must be attending Great Bay Community College
- Student must have completed a FAFSA
- Student must be currently enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more
- Status - Student must be entering or continuing their first year
- Student must be enrolled in at least 6 credits

• GBCC Retention Scholarship for Returning Students

Overview

This scholarship is intended to **cover the gap between free money** (federal, state, or other grants/scholarships that do not require repayment) **and the cost of attending Great Bay** (tuition, fees, books, and supplies). Individual awards will likely range from \$250 to \$1,000.

To be eligible, students must be enrolled at least half time (6 or more credits) in a degree or certificate program for the fall, must have completed a FAFSA, must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better, must be making satisfactory academic progress in their program (meeting all 3 financial aid standards) and must have completed at least 12 credits towards a certificate or 24 credits towards a degree. Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received, and scholarships will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Qualifications

- Student must be attending Great Bay Community College
- Student must have completed a FAFSA
- Student must be currently enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more
- Status - student must be entering or continuing their 2nd year
- Student must be enrolled in at least 6 credits
- Student must have completed at least 12 credits for a certificate and 24 for a degree program
- Student must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

• LRCC Dale T. Jones Memorial Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship was established in memory of Dale Jones, a Fire Sciences student at LRCC. Dale served as Captain of the Waterbury Vt. Fire Department and Chief Training Officer, as well as the University of Vermont-Burlington Fire Department.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be enrolled at Lakes Region Community College.
- Applicant must be a VT resident.

- Applicant must be enrolled in the Fire Science or Fire Protection program.
- Applicant must be a full-time student.

• LRCC Frank Fernald Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship was established in memory of Frank Fernald, retired Captain of the Portsmouth Fire Department. Frank's life-long dedication to the fire service was admired by many.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be enrolled in the Fire Protection or Fire Science program.
- Applicant must be enrolled at Lakes Region Community College.
- Applicant must be at least a part-time or full-time student.
- Applicant must have at least a 3.0 Cumulative GPA.
- Applicant must be currently enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more.

• LRCC H. James Tyler Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship was established in 1999 in memory of Jim Tyler and his many contributions to the Graphic Arts industry and graphic arts students at LRCC. As owner of Tyler Press in Laconia, he was the first president of the NH Graphic Arts Association.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be enrolled in the Graphic Arts program.
- Applicant must be enrolled at Lakes Region Community College.
- Applicant must be a full-time student.

• LRCC Joe Mastrullo Jr. / Mallards Landing Assoc. Memorial Scholarship Fund

Overview

This scholarship was established in memory of Joe Mastrullo Jr., a licensed electrician, to show support for continuing education and trade skills. Preference will be given to residents of Mallard's Landing and Belmont. Scholarships for first year students will be applied to their account for the Spring semester. Returning students will then receive an additional payment for the fall term of their second year provided they are continuing in the Electrical Technologies Program.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be matriculated in the Electrical Technologies Associate Degree program.
- Applicant must be enrolled at Lakes Region Community College.
- Applicant must be a full-time student.

• LRCC Sam Baker Memorial Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship for LRCC Marine Technology students was established in 1993 in memory of Sam Baker, a career marine technician in the Squam Lakes area.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be enrolled at Lakes Region Community College.
- Applicant must be matriculated in the Marine Technology program.

• MCC Medallion Fund Scholarship

Overview

The purpose of this fund is to provide need based scholarships to students enrolled at Manchester Community College. Preference will be given to those enrolled in the trade certificate and degree programs, such as construction, electrical, engineering, HVAC, manufacturing, plumbing, robotics, transportation, welding, etc.

Qualifications

- Student must be currently enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more.
- Student must be enrolled in at least 6 credits.
- Student must be attending Manchester Community College.
- Student must be enrolled in one of the trades certificate or degree programs.
- Student must have completed a FAFSA.

• MCC Quentin C. Walsh Memorial Scholarship

Overview

The goal of this scholarship is to honor Quentin C. Walsh who was a dedicated professor for 25 years in the Building Construction Program. Professor Walsh was a knowledgeable and patient teacher who exemplified hard work, integrity, and a generous spirit. Mr. Walsh was always available to the students and they respected and admired him. He offered encouragement to the students and graduates would return through the years to see and talk with him. Applicants for this scholarship should have demonstrated a sincere and enthusiastic interest in either Electrical Technology, HVAC or Welding class work and laboratory practice during their enrollment.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be in a Construction Technologies degree-granting program (including Electrical Technology, HVAC or Welding) at MCC.
- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.
- Applicant must be attending Manchester Community College (MCC)
- Applicant must be a returning student.
- Applicant must be a full-time student.
- Applicant must have at least a 2.5 Cumulative GPA.

• NCC Brandon Masterson Automotive Technology Tool Scholarship

Overview

The Brandon Masterson Automotive Technology Tool Scholarship is in memory of NCC Automotive Technology Student, Brandon Masterson, who passed away in 2013 just months before his graduation. During his life, Brandon was a student and person to be emulated. The scholarship is a \$1,000 award toward the cost of tools.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be enrolled in the NCC Automotive Technology Program or enrolled in the NCC Honda Automotive Technology PACT Program and active in the Autocross Club.
- Applicant must be enrolled in senior level automotive courses during semester of scholarship.
- Applicant must demonstrate financial need as determined by completed FAFSA.
- Applicant must have a valid driver's license and good driving record.
- Applicant must demonstrate good moral character and leadership.
- Applicant must be attending Nashua Community College.
- Applicant must be enrolled full time at NCC (12 or more credits)
- Applicant must have at least a 2.5 Cumulative GPA.

• NCC Carl Perkins Scholarship

Overview

Carl Perkins Scholarships are available for tuition, books, and other educational supplies, such as laptops, webcams, lab kits, safety supplies, or other materials required by the program. The amount awarded will vary according to need. Eligible students are those enrolled in career and technical education programs and who are included in at least one of the following population groups:

- * Individuals with disabilities

- * Single Parents
- * Out of workforce individuals

• NCC Robert Lawton Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to returning Human Services students at NCC who are enrolled at least part-time and have completed a FAFSA. Students will be asked to obtain a faculty recommendation and complete an essay for the scholarship committee.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be a returning student.
- Currently enrolled at least part-time.
- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.

• NHTI Alumni Scholarship

The Alumni Scholarship is awarded to both first-year and returning students who have an interest in working for the betterment of the college and the local community. Preference is given to dependents of NHTI alumni.

Qualifications

• NHTI Boys & Girls Club Scholarships

Overview

NHTI-Concord Boys & Girls Club Scholarships are awarded to qualified NHTI students who demonstrate strong academic skills and leadership potential while also being active in campus life and community service at NHTI. The Boys & Girls Club Basketball Classic held every November at NHTI between Rivier University and Plymouth State University Basketball programs is the primary fundraiser for the scholarships. • NHTI Chester W. French Scholarship

Overview

French Scholarship is awarded to a recent high school graduate from John Stark Regional High School, Hillsborough and/or Hopkinton and are accepted into any of the engineering technology programs at NHTI. Priority is given to students who have successfully completed a Project Lead The Way course.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be in the Engineering Technology fields at NHTI.
- Applicant must have graduated from either John Stark Regional High School, Hillsboro-Deering High School or Hopkinton High School
- Applicant must attending NHTI-Concord.

• NHTI Civil Rights Scholarship

Overview

This scholarship will provide financial assistance to students who are actively committed to civil rights and advancement of diversity, equity and inclusion. Awards may be used for tuition, fees, and/or room and board.

Qualifications

- Student must be attending NHTI - Concord's Community College
- Student must be currently enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more
- Student must enrolled in at least 6 credits

• NHTI David Scott Turner Memorial Scholarship

Overview

David Scott Turner was a 1988 graduate of the NHTI Paramedic Emergency Medicine program who lost his life in an automobile accident in June 1990. David work in EMS in both Massachusetts and NH. This is a \$500.00 scholarship for NHTI Nursing Students.

Qualifications

- Student must be enrolled at NHTI
- Student must be matriculated in the Nursing Program.
- Student must be enrolled at least part-time, taking 6 credits or more.

• NHTI Edward C. Sweeney, Jr. Scholarship

Overview

The Edward C. Sweeney, Jr. Scholarship is awarded each year to a student who meets the following criteria: students must have a visible and permanent walking disability; must be a NH resident who graduated from a NH high school; must maintain satisfactory academic progress in accordance with financial aid requirements. This award will be used to defray tuition expenses. Applicants must include two recommendation letters. Letters may come from secondary school principal, secondary school guidance counselor, secondary school teacher, or by two others such as clergyman, employer, or long-time acquaintance.

• NHTI Elizabeth “Betsy” Antonucci Memorial Scholarship Fund

Overview

For Dental Hygiene Students. This scholarship was established in 2014 by Bruce R. Courtney in memory of Betsy Antonucci who was a truly caring person and practicing dental hygienist for 36 years. Betsy was a 1978 graduate of NHTI. This scholarship is available for senior Dental Hygiene students. The \$500 scholarship will be applied directly to the scholarship recipient’s account in the Bursar’s Office for the Spring semester.

This scholarship is named in memory of Jen Kemp, a graduate of the Sports Management program who worked in the NHTI Athletics/Wellness Center Office. She passed away unexpectedly in 2004. The scholarships will be awarded twice a year (spring and fall semesters) to qualified students who demonstrate strong academic skills and leadership potential, while also being active in campus life and community service at NHTI. The NHTI/Northeast Delta Dental Road Race is the primary fundraiser for this scholarship. Since the inception of this scholarship, over \$58,000 has been awarded to deserving NHTI students helping to make a difference.

• NHTI Maxwell Miller Photography Scholarship

Overview

The Maxwell Miller Scholarship was established in 2014 in memory of "Max" and his love of photography. He received his Associate in Arts in Visual Arts with a concentration in photography, and went on to continue his education in the Bachelor of Fine Arts at UMass-Lowell. • NHTI Mr. Devi Timsina Memorial Scholarship for New Americans

Overview

The Mr. Devi Timsina Memorial Scholarship for New Americans was established in 2012. The primary purpose of this scholarship is to assist responsible, diligent students who entered the United States as a refugee, including but not limited to those who have since obtained U.S. Citizenship. Students applying for this scholarship must have submitted a FAFSA (Federal Application for Student Aid). Students can be enrolled part-time or full-time and must be matriculated into a degree program and must be in good academic standing (passing all classes). This scholarship is named in memory of former NHTI student Mr. Devi Timsina. IMPORTANT NOTES: 1. Student must provide documentation of current or former legal refugee status (I-94 card with an alien number on the back or permanent resident card or other).

Qualifications

- Applicant must have filed the FAFSA.
- Eligible students are those who entered the United States as a refugee, including those who have since obtained U.S. Citizenship.
- Applicant must be attending NHTI-Concord.
- Applicant must have completed at least one semester at NHTI.

• NHTI NH Dental Society and the Davis and Towle Insurance Group

Overview

• NHTI Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

Overview

NHTI Alpha Upsilon Omicron Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarship

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) is an international honor society for students attending two-year colleges. Alpha Upsilon Omicron is NHTI’s campus Chapter, which seeks to recognize and encourage scholarships among students, develop opportunities for leadership, fellowship, and service, as well as provide an intellectual climate for continued academic excellence.

• NHTI Student Senate Graduating Student Award

Overview

The Student Senate awards two graduating seniors \$1,000 each to be used towards their second semester NHTI expenses. Judging is based on 90% contribution to student life and 10% for academic performance.

Qualifications

- Applicant must be attending NHTI-Concord.
- Applicant must be a 2nd year student.
- Applicant must have at least a 2.5 Cumulative GPA.

• NHTI Student Senate Returning Student Award

Overview

The Student Senate annually awards \$1,000 to four returning students, to be applied to tuition only, in the upcoming academic year including the summer semester. Judging is based on 90% contribution to student life and 10% for academic performance. All applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher and a minimum of 12 credits earned.

- Applicant must be enrolled at NHTI-Concord.
- Applicant must have at least a 2.5 Cumulative GPA.
- Applicant must have completed at least 12 credit hours.
- Applicant must have earned at least 12 credits

• NHTI Theresa Swindell Ceramics Scholarship

Overview

The Theresa Swindell Scholarship was established in 2018 in memory of "Tess" and her love of ceramics. She received her Associate in Arts in Visual Arts with high honors with a concentration in ceramics. She went on to complete a Bachelor In Fine Arts with a scholarship from Utah State University and aspired to begin a Masters of Fine Arts in Ceramics. The purpose of this scholarship is to offer funding of an advanced study in ceramics and may be used towards tuition or supplies.

• RVCC Commit to Complete Scholarship

The Transfer Pathway Scholarship will fund a free course (up to \$645) for new RVCC students who have completed a FAFSA and are matriculated in one of the following programs:

Accounting, Biological Sciences, Business Management, Criminal Justice, Cybersecurity & Healthcare IT, Early Childhood Education, Healthcare Management, Information Technology, Liberal Arts, Networking, or Social Services.

Qualifications
