### **Visual Impairment**

- ZoomText Magnifier/Reader software installed a needed classroom computer
- Speak to text software (see below)

## **Hearing Impairment\*\*\***

- FM System for individual use
- CART ASL Services
- Live ASL interpreter hired as needed
- ASL Apps (supplementary/back up resource)
- Otter.ai or other similar software for Live Notes/Captioning/Transcription

#### **Speech to Text Software**

- Google Speak
- Microsoft Word Dictate (Office 360 available free to students & employee)

#### **Classroom Equipment**

- Adapted mouse
- Specialize seating

#### **Assistive Devices** (limited availability)

- Digital Recorders
- Digital textbooks
- CCTV to enlarge text
- Portable scanner
