



Why choose Nursing ?

The faculty and staff of Nashua Community College and its Nursing Program are facilitating the education of the next generation of nurses. Our career-experienced faculty support the student’s development through comprehensive classroom instruction, in-depth scenarios in a state-of-the-art simulation lab and purposeful clinical placements that allow for theory and practice to be integrated for optimal learning.

In addition to reinforcing ethical, professional, caring and compassionate behavior, the faculty are promoting critical thinking in all our graduates so they are proactive rather than reactive nurses.

All this is done in a small class size of 24 students, which allows for personalized attention that larger programs cannot provide. Students who complete the nursing program are prepared to take the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Licensing Exam (NCLEX) to practice as an entry-level registered nurse.

Please use this checklist to track your progress.

In order to apply to the nursing program, you must:

- Attend a Nursing Information Session. Dates can be found on our website: www.nashuacc.edu.
- Complete application for admission to the program (obtained at Info Session).
- Self – Certification on Application - Nashua Community College provides students you with the opportunity to self-certify on your application that you have graduated or will graduate from high school or have received the equivalent of a high school diploma (For example: an accredited alternative diploma program, HiSET or GET) by the start date of the semester for which you are applying. While you are given the opportunity to self-certify, transcripts may be used in course placement and used as proof of successful completion of specific courses; therefore, you are encouraged to submit transcripts in order to be accurately placed into college courses.
- Submit proof of completion of Anatomy & Physiology I and Introduction to Psychology with a C+ or higher. If previously taken, we will only accept these courses if they are within 5 years from the start of the first nursing course (Fall 2021). They cannot be older than fall 2016.
- Pre-admission Examination: Complete the *Test of Essential Academic Skills* (TEAS) by Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) with an adjusted individual score in the following categories: Reading – 74.5% or higher, Math – 68.8% or higher, Science 55.3% or higher and English 66.7% or higher.
 - o Register online at www.atitesting.com. Seating is limited – register early.
 - o The TEAS must be taken within 2 years of the first nursing course
 - o Can be taken three times in a calendar year; but you must wait six weeks between each attempt.
- Two professional confidential references, work or education related (forms provided by the College – located on our website under Download Forms and Publications). The references should come in a sealed envelope mailed directly to the Admissions Office or emailed to nashua@ccsnh.edu. References are good for two years from the date of signature.
- Submit transcripts of previous college credits (if applicable) to be evaluated for transferability.
- Ability to meet the Health, Character and Technical Standards for the ASN program as stated in the Nashua Community College Catalog: www.nashuacc.edu.

Important Information:

If you have transfer credits in Anatomy and Physiology I & II, Microbiology, Introduction to Psychology, or Human Growth and Development, they must be no more than five years old from the start of the first nursing course with a minimum grade of 'C+'. We will not accept these courses if you took them before fall 2016; you will have to retake them.

Advanced Placement for Licensed Practical Nurses

Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN's) may have the opportunity to transfer into the ASN program with advanced standing in the spring semester of the first year on a space available basis. Deadline for admission to the spring 2021 semester is November 1, 2020.

- All general admission requirements of the College and admission requirements to the nursing program must be met, with the exclusion of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS).
- Submit proof of active LPN license
- Complete the National League for Nursing (NLN) Nursing Acceleration Challenge Exam (NACE I) and attain an overall percent score of 74% or higher. Applicants who successfully complete the NLN NACE exam and are accepted into the program will be awarded 8 credits in place of NURS125 – Fundamental Concepts and Skills for Nursing Practice.
- Completion of Introduction to Psychology, Anatomy and Physiology I, Human Growth & Development and Anatomy & Physiology II with a C+ or higher prior to entering the program in the spring semester.

Transfer Students

Transfer students who have been enrolled in a nursing program within the past five years may have the opportunity to transfer into the ASN program at NCC on a space available basis. Deadline for admission to the spring 2021 semester is November 1, 2020.

- All general admission requirements of the College and admission requirements to the nursing program must be met, with the exclusion of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), exam as long as nursing courses were taken.
- Nursing credits must be no more than five years old from the start of the first nursing class at NCC and have a minimum grade of B-.
- Anatomy & Physiology I & II, Microbiology, Introduction to Psychology and Human Growth & Development courses must be no more than five years old from the start of the first nursing class at NCC and have a minimum grade of C+.
- Complete the National League for Nursing (NLN) Nursing Acceleration Challenge Exam (NACE I)
- Submit a letter of reference on school letterhead from the director of the nursing program at the previous school.

Time Allotment for Program Completion

- All nursing courses must be completed with five (5) years of the date of entry into the first nursing course.
- Completion of the ASN degree does not guarantee RN licensure.
- Students must follow the program of study requirements as published in the College Catalog in the academic year of their acceptance into the ASN Program. In the event of a curriculum change prior to completion and phasing out of previous courses, the student may be required to repeat one or more courses for placement in the new curriculum.
- In order to progress in the program, students must earn a minimum grade of B- in all nursing courses and a minimum grade of C+ in Anatomy & Physiology I & II, Microbiology, Introduction to Psychology and Human Growth & Development.
- Students who do not meet the criteria for progression may seek reentry into the program at the point of last success with approval from the chair of the department on a space available basis. Re-entry is not guaranteed and students will only be granted one opportunity to reenter the program.

Selection Criteria

Selection is determined by a cumulative point based system that looks at applicable courses and grades; TEAS scores and references. The Vice President of Student and Community Affairs and the Chair of the Department of Nursing will review applications and make the admission decisions. Preference will be given to applicants who:

- ✓ Are New Hampshire residents
- ✓ Have higher grades for A&P I and II relative to the applicant pool
- ✓ Have completed a greater number of nursing related general education courses relative to the applicant pool
- ✓ Have a history of academic success

Qualified students who are not accepted in the initial selection process may be assigned to a prioritized waiting list based on the above criteria. They may subsequently be admitted if an opening becomes available. The waiting list will end once classes begin. Applicants still desiring admission must then reapply.

Upon Conditional Acceptance

- You will be invited to a mandatory nursing orientation to obtain information about required documents that must be submitted prior to beginning the first nursing course. It is understood that acceptance is conditional upon submission of the required documents.
- You will be required to complete a criminal background check (specific information to be given at orientation)
 - Individuals with a court record or a criminal conviction may wish to contact the Board(s) of Registration in Nursing in any state in which they plan to work for guidelines. The NH Board of Nursing can be reached at 603-271-2323. This will allow the individual to make an informed decision about choosing to pursue nursing education at this time.
- Fees may include but are not limited to:
 - Clinical Fees;
 - Assessment Technologies Institute® (ATI) testing package;
 - V-Sim virtual patient software;
 - DocuCare Electronic Medical Record (EMR) software
 - Uniform, stethoscope, penlight, watch with a second hand, textbooks, skills lab kit and supplies for lab practice, nursing pins;
 - NCLEX preparation and licensure

**Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS®)
Fall 2022 RN Pre-Admission Examination Information
(Application Deadline: March 1, 2020)**

The TEAS® exam is a pre-admission exam for RN programs that measures basic skills in Reading, Mathematics, Science, and English & Language Usage. It is administered by Assessment Technologies Institute, LLC. It is a timed, computerized, 170-item multiple-choice test.

To qualify for the NCC Nursing program, students must meet the minimum cutoff scores:

Reading	74.5
Math	68.8
Science	55.3
English	66.7

FAQs

What is the ATI TEAS®?

The ATI TEAS® measures basic essential skills in the academic content areas of reading, mathematics, science and English & language usage. These entry-level skills were deemed important for health science program applicants by a panel of subject matter experts. The TEAS® is required for students submitting applications to the RN Nursing program at Nashua Community College.

How can I best prepare for taking the TEAS®?

We recommend a review of basic concepts and theories in the areas of reading, mathematics, science and English & language usage. The official ATI TEAS® study manual (sixth edition) is now available for purchase. To purchase the study guide, visit the ATI website. The Nashua Public Library offers study guides for the exam as well.

Where can I take the TEAS®?

Students can take it at NCC or any institution that offers the exam. You can view testing center locations, exam dates and times, and sign up for it online at www.atitesting.com. You have to create an account with ATI before you can sign up. Registration and payment is done online directly through the ATI website.

What is the format of the TEAS®?

The TEAS® is a computerized, 170 multiple-choice question test divided into four subsections: Mathematics, Reading, Science, and English & Language Usage. Time limit is 209 minutes.

- **Reading** – key ideas & details; craft & structure; integration of knowledge & ideas (53 questions, 64 minutes)
- **Math** – whole numbers; algebra; measurement & data (36 questions, 54 minutes)
- **Science** – human anatomy & physiology; life and physical sciences; scientific reasoning (53 questions, 63 minutes)
- **English & Language Usage** – conventions of standard English; knowledge of language; vocabulary acquisition (28 questions, 28 minutes)

Can I use a calculator on the TEAS®?

There is a calculator embedded within the exam.

How long will it take to receive my TEAS® scores?

If you have taken the computer-administered TEAS® at NCC, your scores are available immediately after the examination. **Even if you take the TEAS® Exam at NCC, you must print out a copy of your official results and submit them to the Admissions Office.**

How do I know if I passed the TEAS® for entrance into NCC's Nursing program?

Applicants must achieve the following scores; Reading – 74.5% or higher; Math – 68.8% or higher; Science 55.3% or higher; and English 66.7% or higher.

How do I get an official TEAS® transcript sent to another college?

You can send your TEAS® results to any nursing school by logging into your ATI account online. ATI will send your results electronically to another school for a small fee.
