- CCSLA Conference Report- Conference Attendees-Mackenzie reported on the CCSLA "Spirit of Leadership" conference. - VI. Unfinished Business:
 - A) Halloween Party and Safe Trick or Treating will be Monday October 31st-Nikki Reed Nikki reviewed how she would need help with decorating and shopping and to please see her if you are interested in helping.
 - **B)** Activity Budgets:
 - i. Gay Straight Alliance Boston Pride Parade- Cameryn Boland- The GSA Club requested \$1500 (brought down from their original request of \$3000) towards their annual trip to the Boston Pride Parade. The total cost will be closer to \$3000 but they will supplement their costs with fundraised funds, student contributions, and their current club budget. \$1500 was approved by majority vote to go to the GSA Club.
 - ii. Magna Club Anime Boston Trip-Mike Bauer- The Magna Club requested \$2300 (brought down from their original request of \$4000) for their annual trip to Anime Boston. They will bring 15 students and one advisor. This, combined with their club and fundraising budget will cover the cost of hotel, convention registration, and chaperone travel and meal expenses. \$2300 was approved by majority vote to go to the Magna Club.
 - iii. World Language Club- Various on and off campus activities (\$2250.00) Passed The World Language Club requested \$2250 total (brought down from their original request of (\$11,450 with breakdown below)

Multicultural Luncheon: \$2700 Spring Break Trip to Boston: \$750 Around the World Dinner: \$3500 NYC Trip: \$4500

The \$2250 was requested to go towards their Spring Break trip to Boston and the Multicultural Tasting. The World Language Club advisor, Elizabeth Berry attended the previous week's finance committee meeting and the Finance Committee

approved those changes. There was some confusion after this was presented as Amy Vazifdar mistakenly wrote "Around the World Dinner" instead of "Multicultural Tasting", which confused everyone as the Around the World Dinner is a fundraiser and it was clarified that fundraisers cannot be paid out of club funds. After much discussion, which primarily surrounded the WLC's current balance at the time of the meeting, of an estimate of just over \$8,000. The Club clarified that this money was encumbered to specific charities and projects. As \$2250 had been approved by the Finance Committee, Amy Vazifdar clarified that this was what needed to be voted on at this time, and it was approved by majority vote to go to the World Language Club.

iv. Rotaract Give Kids the World Trip from Fundraising (\$1,500). The Rotaract Club is sponsoring a trip in January to the Give Kids the World Village in Kissimmee, Florida. They have done extensive fundraising and can cover the cost of the airfare, housing, and rental van for ten people. They are requesting \$1500 to help cover the cost of their meals while they are down there. They are renting a house and will be cooking all of their own meals. The \$1500 was approved by majority vote to go to the Rotaract Club.

v. GAINZ Club Trip (\$1250) Passed by majority vote

The Finance Committee discussed the GAINZ Club Trip and the Hospitality Club Trip to NYC below. Both budgets were submitted after the deadline and were therefore reviewed after all of the other budgets had been approved. Basically, with what was left over in the Senate account (approximately \$3300), and needing some money for unplanned-for expenses, the Finance Committee agreed to allot \$1250 to each club to put towards the requested trips. The Senate approved this expenditure by majority vote.

vi. Hospitality Club NYC Trip (\$1250) Passed by majority vote (See statement under Section VI, letter "B", item v. GAINZ Club Trip above).
