Bridges, 33 East Pearl St., Nashua, NH 03060 24-Hour Support Line (603-883-3044) Office (603-889-0858): Services for victims and survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, child sexual abuse, elder abuse, stalking, and harassment. Services include crisis intervention, emergency shelter, court advocacy, support groups, and education and outreach to both women and men.

Corpus Christi Food Pantry, 3 Crown St., Nashua, NH 03060 (603-882-6372): Food pantry and limited financial assistance. Appointment needed to determine eligibility.

Family Promise of Southern New Hampshire, PO Box 450, 3 Crown Street, Nashua, NH 03060 (603-883-7338): Guides families as they rise from homelessness to sustainable independence. Unique in the area, FPSNH serves families of all compositions, including single-fathers, two-parent families, single mothers, pregnant women, and any other type of family. FPSNH provides a residential facility where families work with Family Services comprehensive financial and housing plans and receive courses in financial literacy, parenting, and life-skills. Our focus is on protecting the family unit.

The Front Door Agency, Inc., 7 Concord St., Nashua, NH 03064 (603-886-2866): Offers support and provides services to assist individuals and families transition from crisis to self-sufficiency. Assistance with back rent, utility arrearages, security deposit loans, rapid rehousing, transitional housing for single women & children, financial literacy and other basic needs. Office hours Monday-Thursday, 8:30am-4:30pm by appointment.

Gate City Bike Coop, 17b Airport Rd, Nashua, NH 03063 (603 759-9056): Provides bicycles via a voucher system through local agencies. Teaches bike maintenance. Web site: www.gatecitybikecoop.org and email: gatecitybikecoop@gmail.com. Open to the public on Mondays from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m.

Greater Nashua Mental Health, 7 Prospect St., Nashua, NH 03060 (603-889-6147): Behavioral health services for all ages including individual, family and group psychotherapy, psychopharmacology for clients engaged in therapy, crisis intervention and stabilization, case management, outreach, substance use disorder services for adults and adolescents ages 16 and upward, supported employment services, and integrated primary health care services for current clients. Education, information, and referral related to all aspects of behavioral health available. Mission: Empowering people to lead full and satisfying lives through effective treatment and support.

Greater Nashua Dental Connection, Inc., 31 Cross St., Nashua, NH 03064 (603-879-9314): Provide affordable dental services, accepts Medicaid. Appointments necessary.

Harbor Care, 77 Northeastern Blvd. Nashua, NH 03060 (603-882-3616): Residential and supportive services including psychotherapy, psychopharmacology, case management, and employment services. Also operates a Safe Haven and three residential programs for *homeless veterans*.

Harbor Care Clinic and Wellness Center, 45 High Street, Nashua, NH 03060 (603-821-7788): Primary Care for children and adults, Mental Health counseling, Substance Use counseling including groups, Behavioral Health medication management (psychopharmacology), Dental for children and adults, low-cost Pharmacy on-site, case management, insurance enrollment and application assistance, benefits counseling, and supportive employment services. All services available on a sliding fee basis for any under 200% of the federal poverty guidelines regardless of insurance status.

The Homeless Outreach Program (HOP), is a program within Harbor Homes Inc. The program offers ongoing case management and counseling for adults in Hillsborough County experiencing homelessness and living with a substance use disorder. HOP offers assistance with navigating community resources to obtain permanent and supportive housing, pre-employment, obtaining insurance and benefits, connection to SUD treatment resources, and connection to medical and oral health care services. Keystone Hall (Greater Nashua Council on Alcoholism), 615 Amherst St., Nashua, NH 03060 (603-881-4848): Comprehensive services for chemically dependent persons including crisis intervention, case management, transitional living, women and Men's program. Outpatient counseling at 45 High St.

H.E.A.R.T.S. Peer Support of Greater Nashua Region VI, 5 Pine St. Ext. Unit 1G, Nashua, NH 03060 (603-882-8400): Fax (603)882-8700 Is an Adult Educational Wellness Center for those struggling with the daily effects of mental health challenges. Membership requirement is for adults over the age of 18 who have used publicly funded Mental Health Services in the past, present or at risk of. We are open 8 am to 5 pm Monday thru Thursday and Friday 8 am to 4 pm. The Center offers holistic support groups, educational groups, employment supports, access to computers, community resources, movies, games, social activities, we create a sense of community, and monthly field trips. We offer arranged transportation to and from the center. Peer Crisis Respite is a 2 bed-room non-medical home like environment alternative to hospitalization where people can stay with us 1 to 7 days. We are not a homeless shelter or an overflow, and we ask that folks are able to manage their own medications as needed. Contact the Respite center or phone for a pre-interview prior to your stay or call Phone # (603)-864-8769: Fax # (603) 864-8482. We have a new Pilot Program now called Step-up/Step-down. Which is a non-medical short-term transitional stay for those that might need a little more time to be successful in transitioning back into their community. This is a goal orientated program and works with your providers and support systems to insure a better chance of success. This can be anywhere from a 30 to 90 day stay living in a 3-bedroom home like environment. We require a 2-part referral process which is available on our website www.heartspsa.org and can and should be done with your provider whenever possible. Phone # (603)521-8372: Fax # (603)943-7194. We also offer a Peer Support Warm Line 1-888-306-4334 available 7 day a week from 5pm to 10pm for after-hours peer support.

Lamprey Health Care, 22 Prospect St., Nashua, NH 03060 (603-883-1626): Lamprey Health Care, Nashua Center provides comprehensive primary care services to individuals in the Greater Nashua Community regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay. These services include routine preventive and sick care, diagnostic evaluations, prenatal care, pediatric care, disease management and education for chronic illnesses, pharmacy assistance, nutrition education, case management, behavioral health services, and health education.

Nashua Soup Kitchen & Shelter, 2 Quincy St., Nashua, NH 03061 (603-889-7770): Services include meals, food pantry, fresh produce, emergency shelter for homeless individuals and families, case management, employment and education advocacy and Hispanic Advocacy.

New Hampshire Bureau of Elderly & Adult Services, 26 Whipple St Nashua, NH 03060 (603-883-7726): Services to help elderly and disabled adults remain at home or placement services when needed. Protective investigations for reports of abuse, neglect, self-neglect and exploitation of incapacitated adults.

New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services, Nashua District Office, 26 Whipple St Nashua, NH 03060 (603-883-7726): Provides a comprehensive and coordinated system of services to promote and protect the health, safety and well-being of NH citizens. Directed at supporting families, strengthening communities and developing the independence and self-sufficiency of NH citizens to the extent possible. Applications for food stamps, TANF, APTD/OAA/ANB, Medicaid.

New Hampshire Division for Children, Youth and Families-Child Protective Services, 26 Whipple St Nashua, NH 03060 (603-883-7726): Services to children, youth and families experiencing child abuse or neglect.

New Hampshire Job Corps Center, 943 Dunbarton Road, Manchester, NH 03102 (603-621-9555): No cost, residential technical training and academic programs offered on state-of-the-art campus. Available to individuals age 16-24 who meet certain low-income guidelines. Highly sought industry recognized training in Advanced Manufacturing, Electrical, Facilities Maintenance, Culinary Arts, Hospitality, Security and Protective Services, Licensed Nursing Assistant, Clinical Medical Assistant, and Medical Administrative Assistant fields. High School Equivalency programs and Driver's Education included. On Center dormitory housing available to all students. Career support available to all students upon completion of Job Corps, transition support for one year after graduation. All services are offered at no cost to participants. Job Corps, Careers Begin Here.

New Hampshire Legal Assistance (NHLA), New Hampshire Legal Assistance (NHLA): provides civil (not criminal) legal services in New Hampshire to people with low income and older adults. Services are primarily related to housing, public benefits, and domestic violence. NHLA has offices in Berlin, Concord, Claremont, Manchester, and Portsmouth. Revive Recovery Center, 263 Main St., Nashua, NH 03060 (888-317-8312): Revive Recovery is a peer recovery support center. Revive's purpose is to open doors and open minds for the individuals in recovery in our community and provide a wide range of services for their mental, physical, and spiritual well-being. Our services include 1-on-1 Recovery Coach Peer Support, Telephone Support Services, Volunteer, and Internship opportunities. We honor ALL PATHWAYS TO RECOVERY: AA, NA, 3 Principles, etc., some of our Activities/Classes offered are: yoga, meditation, hosting of sober home and other types of meetings at the center. We provide resource information on addiction treatment, health services/dental health services, food assistance programs, housing, shelter, transportation, meetings to support all pathways, family support groups, and mental health.
